
To whom it may concern,



I write this on behalf of myself and several older, avid, and physical ailing fishermen whose fishing outings are limited to fishing from the banks of rivers and lakes. Question asked among ourselves concerns the restriction of fishing in the area addressed in section (D), page 56 of the 2013-2914 Freshwater Fishing Regulations.

It was evident the restriction was needed and warranted when the Red Bluff Diversion Dam gates were active in restricting the flow of both water and up stream fish movement which created a mass amount of schooling of fish below the dam. However, that situation seems to no longer exist. Is there other reasons why this restriction could not be removed allowing us old codgers, and others, easier access to to a wonderful section of the river.?
